

### **BSAC Instructor Trainer Requirement**

To be registered as a BSAC Closed Circuit Rebreather (CCR) Instructor Trainer the applicant must provide evidence to the BSAC Technical Chief Examiner that the following pre-requisites have been satisfied:

1. Be a current BSAC member
2. Be a current registered BSAC CCR Instructor.
3. Provide proof of having taught successfully a minimum of two BSAC CCR courses
4. Be or have been an active member of the BSAC Instructor Training Scheme with OWI course status or above  
**OR**  
Be a current CCR Instructor Trainer with a recognised training agency
5. Be recommended to the BSAC Technical Chief Examiner by a current BSAC CCR Instructor Trainer as suitable for inclusion on the BSAC CCR Instructor Trainer Register.

### **Maintenance of BSAC CCR Approved Instructor Trainer Status**

The BSAC Technical Chief Examiner will continually review the certification of all BSAC CCR Instructor Trainers. Part of this process involves reviewing all student and course feedback. In order to continue to be registered to instruct on BSAC CCR courses or BSAC CCR workshops the Instructor Trainer should comply with the following:

1. Be a BSAC member
2. Maintain registration as a BSAC CCR Instructor
3. Maintain BSAC ITS Instructor status or maintain Instructor trainer status with an external agency.

In addition the BSAC Chief Examiner can request proof of continual logged experience of a minimum of 25 rebreather dives annually to demonstrate that the Instructor Trainer is up-to-date with their personal skills.

### **Note on HSE (UK)**

As a BSAC CCR Instructor you have a duty of care to be familiar with and comply with all legal requirements for the country in which the course is to be

run. For example, in the UK: all instructors teaching commercially must comply with the HSE Diving at Work Regulations 1997.

Instructors working within the BSAC Coaching Scheme are exempt from the HSE Diving at Work Regulations 1997 providing they receive no reward for their work. However, BSAC expects that Instructors teaching within the coaching scheme comply fully with BSAC Safe Diving Practices and any associated guidelines.
