

# BSAC Instructor Trainer Standards



## BSAC Advanced Mixed Gas Instructor Trainer

---

To be registered as a BSAC Advanced Mixed Gas Instructor Trainer the applicant must provide evidence to the BSAC Technical Chief Examiner that the following pre-requisites have been satisfied:

1. Be a current BSAC member
2. Be a current registered BSAC Advanced Mixed Gas Instructor.
3. Be a current registered BSAC ERD Instructor Trainer.
4. Have satisfactorily completed a BSAC Advanced Mixed Gas Instructor Trainer workshop demonstrating a safe and responsible attitude.
5. Provide proof of having taught successfully a minimum of 5 specific BSAC Advanced Mixed Gas courses
6. Be or have been an active member of the BSAC Instructor Training Scheme with OWI course status or above

**OR**

Be a current Mixed Gas Instructor Trainer with a recognised training agency

**OR**

Work as an instructor on a minimum of two BSAC Advanced Mixed Gas courses within two years from date of award of qualification

7. Be recommended to the BSAC Technical Chief Instructor by a current BSAC Advanced Mixed Gas Instructor Trainer (or higher) as suitable for inclusion on the BSAC Advanced Mixed Gas Instructor Trainer Register.

# BSAC Instructor Trainer Standards



## BSAC Advanced Mixed Gas Instructor Trainer

### Maintenance of BSAC Approved Instructor Trainer Status

Provided that you continue to have a valid and current BSAC Advanced Mixed Gas instructor award and comply with the following prerequisites defined below then the status of BSAC Advanced Mixed Gas Instructor Trainer shall be maintained:

1. Be a current BSAC Member
2. Be a current registered BSAC Advanced Mixed Gas Instructor
3. Maintain BSAC Instructor Training Scheme (ITS) Instructor status or maintain Instructor trainer status with an external agency or have taught **2** courses in the past **2** years.

#### **Note on HSE**

As a BSAC Advanced Mixed Gas Instructor you have a duty of care to be familiar with and comply with all legal requirements for the country in which the course is to be run. For example, in the UK: all instructors teaching commercially must comply with the HSE Diving at Work Regulations 1997.

Instructors working within the BSAC Coaching Scheme are exempt from the HSE Diving at Work Regulations 1997 providing they receive no reward for their work. However, BSAC expects that Instructors teaching within the coaching scheme comply fully with BSAC Safe Diving Practices and any associated guidelines.
