## BSAC Closed Circuit Rebreather Instructor

### Qualified BSAC Instructor

Candidates for BSAC Approved Closed Circuit Rebreather (CCR) Instructor status may apply to the BSAC Technical Chief Examiner for inclusion on the register of approved BSAC CCR Instructors having fulfilled the following criteria:

1. Be a current BSAC Member
  2. Be a BSAC Open Water Instructor or higher
  3. Be a BSAC Advanced Nitrox Instructor or equivalent
  4. Provide evidence of logging 100 hours over a minimum of 100 dives on the specific CCR in varied conditions
  5. Complete a written instructor exam specific to the CCR with a minimum score of 80%
  6. Be assessed on a BSAC CCR course under the direct supervision of a BSAC CCR Instructor Trainer
- OR**
- Attend an approved BSAC CCR Instructor workshop which includes continuous assessment
7. Be recommended to the BSAC Technical Chief Examiner by a current BSAC CCR Instructor Trainer as suitable for inclusion on the BSAC CCR Instructor Register.

### Hold Existing Technical Instructor Qualifications

Candidates already qualified as rebreather instructors with alternative agencies or qualified as instructors on other CCR units may crossover having fulfilled the following criteria:

1. Be a BSAC member
  2. Provide documented evidence of equivalent technical instructor qualifications
  3. Provide evidence of logging 100 hours over a minimum of 100 dives on the specific CCR in varied conditions
  4. Assist on a BSAC CCR course under the direct supervision of a BSAC CCR Instructor Trainer

- Attend an approved BSAC CCR Instructor crossover workshop

5. Be recommended to the BSAC Technical Chief Examiner as suitable for inclusion on the BSAC CCR Instructor register by an approved BSAC CCR Instructor Trainer

### **Maintenance of BSAC CCR Approved Instructor Status**

The BSAC Technical Chief Examiner will continually review the certification of BSAC CCR Instructors. Part of this process involves reviewing all student and course feedback. In order to continue to be registered to instruct on BSAC CCR courses the instructor must be a BSAC member. In addition the BSAC Chief Examiner can request proof of continual logged experience of a minimum of 25 rebreather dives annually to demonstrate that the Instructor is up-to-date with their personal skills.

### **Note on HSE (UK)**

As a BSAC CCR Instructor you have a duty of care to be familiar with and comply with all legal requirements for the country in which the course is to be run. For example, in the UK: all instructors teaching commercially must comply with the HSE Diving at Work Regulations 1997.

Instructors working within the BSAC Coaching Scheme are exempt from the HSE Diving at Work Regulations 1997 providing they receive no reward for their work. However, BSAC expects that Instructors teaching within the coaching scheme comply fully with BSAC Safe Diving Practices and any associated guidelines.
